The term 'modulator' is derived from its verb form 'modulate' which means 'to adapt or adjust'. So the function of a modulator is to adapt or adjust one thing to another. (In music, however, modulation means changing or passing from one key to another.) If you need to express two different sets of ideas in your paragraph, you will require a context modulator to adjust them. It is a sentence which provides a transition between the different sets of ideas. It is through this sentence that you will pass from one group of developers to the other. It is, therefore, a kind of bridge between two sets of ideas.

As far as its function is concerned, the context modulator does not appear in every paragraph. It occurs only in those paragraphs which contain more than one group of developers. It is, therefore, an additional element of a paragraph. You certainly know that the essential elements of a well written paragraph are its topic sentence. developers and terminator. obtained from both yearsple and enich

The very topic suggestion of a paragraph will tell you whether it will need a context modulator or not. For example, you are asked to write a paragraph on "The Amenities of Town Life". This obviously suggests that your paragraph will contain only one kind of developers. All of them will belong to one group only and they will describe the pleasant things of town life. So in writing this paragraph, you will not require any context modulator. On the other hand, if the topic suggestion is "Advantages and Disadvantages of a Joint Family", it is clear that some of your developers are to be about the advantages of a joint family and some about the disadvantages. Obviously, you have to incorporate two separate groups of developers. First, you will list some advantages in one group and then some disadvantages in another group and between these two groups you will have to write a transition sentence to connect the two different sets of ideas. If you do not use this transitional device, your jump from one thing to another will be risky and abrupt and thereby your paragraph will lose an important element.

Here is a paragraph with two sets of ideas. There is a context modulator in it. As you read the paragraph, try to understand where and how the transition takes place.

Nature and Source of the Major Food Elements

We need three major food elements to keep our body strong and healthy. In the very first place, we need protein which is a nitrogenous compound found in the fluids and tissues of all living organisms. Secondly, we require fat. It is an oily and greasy substance. Thirdly, we are in need of carbohydrate, a compound of carbon, oxygen and hydrogen. We obtain these elements from various sources. For example, protein comes from meat, fish, milk and eggs. On the other hand, fat is obtained from both vegetable and animal sources and carbohydrate is generally derived from fresh fruits, vegetables and cereals. So if our diet is sufficiently varied, it will provide us with all the essential vitamins and minerals.

You must have noticed that this paragraph contains two sets of ideas. In the first set, the three major food elements are named and their nature is described. On the other hand, the second set deals with the sources of these three elements. And in order to connect these different sets of ideas we have used a context modulator, namely "We obtain these elements from various sources." It has provided a smooth transition from the first group of developers to the second.

'Techniques of Paragraph Development' refers to the various methods of developing a topic sentence into a well organised paragraph. In other words, it refers to the organisation of the developers in a paragraph. You should remember that this organisation of the developers depends on their function and is determined by the controlling idea of the paragraph. For example, "Qualities of a Good Teacher" is a topic suggestion and if you are asked to write a paragraph on it, your topic sentence will probably be "A good teacher should have at least five qualities" or something like this. Obviously, 'five qualities' is your controlling idea which suggests that in the developers you are required to make a list of five different qualities a good teacher should possess. And this listing of things maintaining the sequence in a logical order is one of the techniques of paragraph development. You should arrange or organise your developers in such a way as to make them look like a list. In the same way, if the function of your developers is to make a comparison between two things, you should use the technique of comparison to organise your developers. As the functions of the developers in different kinds of paragraphs are different, the techniques to be used in them will also be different.
