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Mahmudul Alam (1946-) is a Professor of School of Education, Open University (BOU), Gazipur, Bangladesh. He was awarded D.Phil (Development Studies) from Institute of Development Studies (IDS), University of Sussex, U.K. in 1982. He earned his B.A. (Honours in Economics) from University of Dhaka in 1968 and M.Sc. (Economics) from Quaid-e-Azam (then Islamabad) University, Pakistan in 1969. He studied at Cambridge University (U.K.) for Post-graduate Diploma in Development Economics (DDE) in 1974-75. Professor Alam started his career as a Lecturer in Economics, University of Chittagong (1970-72). He served Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies (BIDS), Dhaka for about three decades (1972-2002). He worked as Senior Education Economist with the World Bank Dhaka Office, 2002-2004. He has completed a large number of research projects on Education. He has published articles in professional journals at home and abroad. He has organized a good number of training programmes for teachers (both college and school levels), and also for government and NGO-personnel. Nationally and internationally, he has worked as a key consultant in different education-related projects/programmes. Professor Alam is a widely traveled person with a knack to talk to people belonging to different socio-economic categories. He is involved with a number of action-oriented organisations such as Centre for Mass Education in Science (CMES) (Dhaka), Fatehabad Foundation (Chittagong), Education Watch (Dhaka), Integrated Development Foundation (Chittagong).
