PREFACE

This book contains my lectures that I delivered before the LL.B. (Preliminary) students of the University of Dacca in the last two sessions and before the E.P.C.S. (Class I) Probationers (12th batch, 1969) at the Gazetted Officers' Training Academy, Dacca.

When the University authorities abolished six posts of part-time teachers in 1968 on a flimsy ground that the number of students decreased, a heavy load was imposed upon some teachers. I was assigned a number of subjects, viz., (1) Roman Law, (2) Law of Crimes, (3) Law of Evidence and (4) Specific Relief Act. Fortunately, Mr. Justice A.S. Chowdhury was entrusted with the administration of the University in December, 1969. On assumption of office as a Vice-Chancellor of this University, His Lordship realised the importance of the Faculty of Law and sanctioned six posts from the session 1970-71. It is expected that our work load will be reduced after the appointment of the new teachers.

The Law of Crimes comprises two parts, viz., (a) The Pakistan Penal Code, and (b) the Criminal Procedure Code. In order to make the subject interesting I have explained the provisions of the law with reference to interesting leading cases and illustrations. The scope, object and the guiding principles of the sections are indicated. The rulings of the Supreme Court and the High Courts have been incorporated.

In preparing my lectures I have received valuable assistance from Ratanlal Ranchhoddas and Dhirajlal Keshavlal Thakore's Law of Crimes and Dr. Sir Hari Singh Gour's Penal Law of India. I acknowledge my debt to the learned Authors.

In spite of all endeavours it was not possible to publish the book free from mistakes which have caused some damage to the accuracy. I offer my regret for this inconvenience. Readers are referred to the errata provided at the end of the book.

I express my sincere thanks to my publisher whose keen interest has made this publication possible.

I like to place on record my sincere thanks to the authorities of the Eastern Mercantile Bank Ltd., specially to Mr. Jalilur Rahman Chowdhury, M.Com., Manager, Jinnah Avenue Branch, Dacca for extending financial support towards the publication of this book.
